1 Scope

GB 19079.6-2013 is the Chinese national standard on operation conditions and technical requirements for gymnasium and playground - part 6: ski area, in the field of domestic and commercial equipment, entertainment, sport. It carries no /T suffix, which in the Chinese

system means compliance is mandatory: a product or a practice within its scope has to meet it to be lawfully made, sold or carried out in China. It was issued on 10 October 2013 by the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine of the People's Republic of China; Standardization Administration of China, and has been in force since 1 May 2014. Classification: ICS 97.220, CCS Y55. This page is published from the official record of the standard held by the Chinese standards administration: the identification, the dates, the classification and the issuing body are taken from there. The clause text, the tables and the numeric limits are in the document itself, which is delivered complete in English translation.

GB 19079 of the provisions of this part of the skiing open should have the basic conditions and the basic technical requirements. This section applies to all types of skiing and open society.

3 Terms and Definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1 Skiing skiaarea Open to the community, to meet people to places with ski-related training, competition, fitness and leisure activities.

3.2 Ski equipment skiequipmentandaccessories Related tools used when skiing. Including skis, ski boots, anchor, ski poles and ski clothing, ski hats, ski Gloves, ski helmets, ski goggles, ski glasses.

3.3 Skiing instructors skiinstructor To teach skiers skiing theory and skills of staff.

3.4 Piste skitrail Ski activities undertaken specifically taxiing area.

3.5 Stop end zone stopzone Piste terminal taxi stop area.

4 Qualifying

Skiing instructors should hold the relevant national vocational qualification certificate before taking. Cableway management and workers and other relevant practitioners Should obtain the relevant qualifications before taking a national proof. 5 places, facilities and conditions

5.1.1 outdoor piste with a total area of not less than 6000m². Indoor ski slopes with a total area of not less than 3000m². The thickness of the layer of compacted snow after

5.1.2 shall be not less than 30cm, the snow surface shall not have bare earth and rock and other debris, snow surface shall be formed Ice-like.

5.1.3 Each piste stop end zone flat terrain. Outdoor piste end stop area of not less than 1000m², indoor ski resort End stop area of not less than 500m². End stop end zone should be retrofitted with safety facilities.

5.2 facilities, installations and equipment

5.2.1 cableway use and management of special equipment shall comply with regulatory requirements.

5.2.2 In the dangerous location of the ski slopes with a safety net to protect the safety mats and other protective equipment, and set up warning signs in a prominent location.

5.2.3 piste with smooth special machinery and equipment.

5.2.4 first aid room, equipped with special emergency equipment.

5.2.5 with ski equipment maintenance, repair and special equipment.

5.2.6 ski areas and facilities, equipment, components should be made of product quality inspection certificate.

5.3 Auxiliary Facilities

5.3.1 should have clothes storage cabinet.

5.3.2 There are male and female toilets.

5.3.3 There are broadcasting, communications equipment.

5.3.4 Public instructions should be consistent with the identification GB/T 10001.1 requirements. 6 health, environmental management

6.1 should provide outdoor ski day weather forecast.

6.2 Public health area should be kept clean.

6.3 offers Night Skiing pistes light illumination level should not be lower than 200lx.

7 Security

7.1 should establish and improve the safe production responsibility system for posts, rescue and safety management system, as well as equipment and facilities maintenance system, health environmental management And other systems.

7.2 should develop emergency response plans.

7.3 should prominently in the public activity area is provided "ski INSTRUCTIONS", "skier behavior and safety rules" and a variety of ski runs, Lifting equipment distribution chart.

Involving safety matters and special requirements to make real clear instructions and warnings.

7.4 should have anti-slip floor public areas.

7.5 skiing should be equipped with ambulance personnel.

7.6 special first aid equipment should be placed in a prominent location within easy access of the ski area.

7.7 skiing should be no less than 5 ski technical guidance personnel, and public skiing instructors and prominently list photo.

7.8 skiing posts practitioners should wear clearly marked.

7.9 emergency exit and evacuation routes should be identified and kept clear.
