1 Scope

GB 45670.4-2026 is the Chinese national standard covering the water norm for public baths and bathing facilities - per bather, by type of establishment, with the credit given for heat and water recovery. Mandatory, first edition, in force since 1 August 2026. It was issued on 27 June 2026 and has been in force since 1 August 2026, as a first edition. The document is under the responsibility of the Ministry of Water Resources. This page is published from the official record of the 2026 edition; the clause text of a standard this recent is not yet in circulation, and the figures, limits and tables it contains are those of the document itself, delivered in full with the English translation.

This document specifies the calculation method, index values, and management requirements for mandatory water consumption quotas for bathing facilities in the Yellow River Basin. This document applies to existing and newly built [facilities/projects] in the Yellow River Basin and other county-level administrative regions within the Yellow River water supply areas of provinces and autonomous regions through which the Yellow River flows. Water management for the renovation and expansion of commercial bathhouses.

4.1 Calculation Scope

4.1.1 The calculation scope of water consumption should include the water volume taken

from conventional water sources such as surface water, groundwater, and urban water supply networks.

4.1.2 Water used in bathing facilities includes water used directly for showering, tub bathing, pool bathing, and hot spring bathing, as well as water used for drinking, cleaning, and toilet flushing. Use water.

4.2 Calculation Formula Water consumption per person per trip is calculated according to formula (1).

5.Mandatory water consumption quota values The mandatory water quota for bathing facilities should comply with the provisions of Table 1.

According to the "Yellow River Protection Law of the People's Republic of China," the state implements a mandatory water quota management system in the Yellow River basin and formulates Yellow River water quota regulations. Mandatory water use quotas for water-intensive industries and services in the Yellow River Basin. The national standard for mandatory water use quotas is used to measure water conservation in relevant industries in the Yellow River Basin. Water use levels are an important standard and a crucial tool for implementing the rigid water resource constraint system and the mandatory water use quota management system in the Yellow River Basin. This section is also an important technical basis for the country to implement the water abstraction permit system, carry out planned water use management, and conduct water resource assessments and water conservation evaluations. GB 45670, "Water Consumption Quotas for the Service Industry in the Yellow River Basin," specifies the calculation methods based on the water consumption characteristics of different high water-consuming service industries in the Yellow River Basin. The proposed method, which stipulates mandatory water consumption quotas and sets management requirements, consists of the following six parts. --Part

1.Hotels. The purpose is to clarify the calculation methods, indicator values, and management of mandatory water consumption quotas for hotels in the Yellow River Basin. Require. --Part

2.Swimming Venues. The purpose is to clarify the calculation method and index values for mandatory water consumption quotas for swimming venues in the Yellow River Basin. and management requirements. --Part

3.Car Wash Facilities. The purpose is to clarify the calculation method and indicator values

for mandatory water consumption quotas for car wash facilities in the Yellow River Basin. and management requirements. --Part

4.Bathing Facilities. The purpose is to clarify the calculation method and index values for mandatory water consumption quotas for bathing facilities in the Yellow River Basin. and management requirements. --Part

5.Higher Education Institutions. The aim is to clarify the calculation methods, indicator values, and management of mandatory water use quotas for higher education institutions in the Yellow River Basin. Require. --Part

6.Outdoor Artificial Ski Resorts. The purpose is to clarify the calculation of mandatory water consumption quotas for outdoor artificial ski resorts in the Yellow River Basin. Methods, indicator values, and management requirements. Water consumption quotas for the service industry in the Yellow River Basin Part

6 Management Requirements

6.1 A sound water intake and consumption metering system should be established, with different water volumes measured according to water source type, and water metering instruments provided for water-using units and secondary water-using units. The availability rate should reach 100%. Water metering instruments should be verified or calibrated according to regulations and meet the relevant requirements of GB/T 24789 and GB/T 28714. Requirements for the provision and calibration of measuring instruments.

6.2 Original records and statistical ledgers should be established, and water consumption in key areas such as bathing, drinking, cleaning, and toilet flushing, as well as actual water usage for guests, should be regularly recorded. Number of times it takes a person to finish.

6.3 Bathing establishments with water intake exceeding the permitted scale should install online metering facilities and transmit the primary water meter metering data to the pipeline network. The competent water administrative department or the Yellow River Basin management agency with the authority to manage water resources.

6.4 Water facilities should be inspected and maintained regularly to prevent leaks. Water balance tests should be conducted periodically and should comply with GB/T 12452. Relevant requirements.

6.5 Water-saving household appliances that meet the relevant product standards should be used.

6.6 Water-saving signs should be posted in prominent locations in water-using areas such as bathing areas and toilets.

6.7 If the water consumption per person in a bathing facility reaches the Level 1 indicator value, it is considered that the water use efficiency has reached an advanced level.

7.Implementation of the Standard The Level 2 indicator values specified in this document shall be implemented starting from the 7th month after the date of issuance of this document. GB 45670.4-2026.
