1 Scope

GB/T 13356-2024 is the Chinese national standard on milled proso millet (glutinous), in the field of food technology. The /T suffix marks it as a recommended standard: it is not compulsory by itself, but it becomes binding as soon as a contract, a tender or a customer specification calls it up - which in practice is how most foreign buyers meet it. It was issued on 29 September 2024 by the State Administration for Market Regulation; Standardization Administration of China, and has been in force since 1 April 2025. Classification: ICS 67.060, CCS B22. This page is published from the official record of the standard held by the Chinese standards administration: the identification, the dates, the classification and the issuing body are taken from there. The clause text, the tables and the numeric limits are in the document itself, which is delivered complete in English translation.

This document defines millet-related terms and definitions, and specifies quality requirements, inspection rules, labeling, packaging, storage and transportation. Requirements and corresponding inspection methods are described. This document applies to edible commercial millet processed from millet as raw material.

3 Terms and definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1 milled proso millet (glutinous) Rhubarb Rice Soft yellow rice A granular product made from husked and peeled millet.

3.2 Processing accuracy milling degree The degree of cortex remaining on the surface of millet grains after processing.

3.3 Unsound kernel Damaged but still usable millet kernels. Note
