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Foreword

This standard replaces GB/T 15493-1995 "Disabled Athletes functional class shooting and table tennis." The standards are compared with the original GB/T 15493-1995 following changes.

- Shooting functional classification standard from the original four to two, while increasing the standard of shooting a visual disability level;
- Shooting each level, depending on circumstances and respective capabilities trunk is divided into three sub-grade;
- Shooting for each level of the content has been revised;
- Minimum standards disability supplement and revise shooting competition;
- Table Tennis grading standards mainly Added Note

1 Scope

GB/T 15493-2009 is the Chinese national standard on functional classification of shooting and table tennis for disabled athletes, in the field of health care technology. The /T suffix

marks it as a recommended standard: it is not compulsory by itself, but it becomes binding as soon as a contract, a tender or a customer specification calls it up - which in practice is how most foreign buyers meet it. It was issued on 30 September 2009 by the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine of the People's Republic of China; Standardization Administration of China, and has been in force since 1 December 2009. This standard specifies the shooting and table tennis athletes with disabilities functional classification standard. This standard applies to visual disabilities, athletes with spinal cord injury, cerebral palsy, amputations and other physical disabilities.

3 Shooters grading standards

According to the function limited situation and shooting technical requirements are divided into three levels of competition.

3.1 SH1 class When using the pistol and rifle competition, no shooting bracing.

Note. Depending on the lower limbs and the trunk is divided into the following sub-function level.

3.1.1 SH1A level. a standing feature of sitting athletes, functioning torso, shooting backless chair, you can choose standing game.

3.1.2 SH1B level. sitting Competitors, non-functional lower limbs or severe dysfunction, but good pelvis control functions (back, abdominal, back side Good muscle function), can have a low chair shot back.

3.1.3 SH1C level. sitting Competitors, non-functional lower limbs or severe dysfunction, loss of function or torso can still be allowed to chair shot High back.

3.2 SH2 level When using the rifle competition, you need to shoot bracing.

Note. Depending on the lower limbs and the trunk is divided into the following sub-function level.

3.2.1 SH2A level. sitting athlete, a non-functional upper limb or severe impairment of the upper limbs, trunk function well, no shooting chair back, may Select Standing match.

3.2.2 SH2B level. sitting athletes, non-functional lower limbs or severe dysfunction, pelvic control function is good, you can shoot low back chair.

3.2.3 SH2C level. sitting athletes, non-functional lower limbs or severe dysfunction, loss of function or torso still shooting allows high chair Backrest.

3.3 SH3 level Rifles, the lowest level of disability B3 visual disabilities. No merger physical disabilities as SH3X, referring to merge physical disabilities 3.1SH1 level case were set SH3A, SH3B, SH3C.

3.4.1 Pistol by non-executive clap minimum disability criteria

- a) non-executive clap at least through wrist amputation;
- b) non-executive clap Muscle least by 30 points, you can not use non-executive clapping filled bullets;
- c) severe joint movement disorder and have reduced muscle strength and/or motor coordination disorder similar to section a),

3.4.2 Using rifles upper limb disability minimum standards

- a) the lowest limb amputated below the elbow disability, stumps shorter than 2/3 full limb length;
