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Foreword

This document complies with the provisions of GB/T 1.1-2020 "Standardization Work Guidelines Part 1: Structure and Drafting Rules of Standardization Documents". Drafting.

This document replaces GB/T 19526-2004 "Technical Specifications for the Prevention and Control of Parasitic Diseases in Sheep". Compared with GB/T 19526-2004, except for the structure...

Aside from adjustments and editorial changes, the main technical changes are as follows.

- Added sheep infection with Theileria, Babesia, Toxoplasmosis, Coccidiosis, Trematodiasis, Tapeworm, Ticks, and Lice/Flies.

Prevention and control techniques (see 5.2, 5.3, 5.4, 5.5, 5.6, 5.9, 5.12, 5.14);

- The prevention and control requirements have been revised, and separate prevention and control measures are now implemented for major sheep parasitic diseases (see Chapter 6, Chapter 3 of the 2004 edition);
- Added evaluation of treatment effectiveness (see 6.2.1.2.4);
- Immunoprophylaxis has been added (see 6.3);
- Added biosafety management requirements (see Chapter 7);
- Added record and file management (see Chapter 8).

1 Scope

This document specifies the general requirements for sheep parasitic disease prevention and control, monitoring and diagnosis, prevention and control, and biosafety management requirements, and describes the corresponding... The verification method.

This document applies to sheep Theileria, sheep Babesia, sheep Toxoplasmosis, sheep Coccidiosis, sheep trematode infection, and sheep tapeworm infection (Monietzia tapeworm).

Sheep tapeworm infection (including uterine tapeworm and non-vitiligocystis), sheep tapeworm larval infection (including echinococcosis, polycercariae, and cysticercus gracilis), sheep nematode infection, sheep mites, sheep ticks, sheep...

It is applicable to the prevention and control of mad flies and sheep lice; it is also applicable to the prevention and control of canine tapeworm disease.

3 Terms and Definitions

This document does not contain any terms or definitions that need to be defined.

4.1 Personnel Requirements

Technical personnel implementing prevention and control measures should undergo relevant technical training, strictly adhere to operating procedures, and ensure the safety of humans and animals.

4.2 Facility and Equipment Requirements

4.2.1 The medicinal bath should be leak-proof and built in a low-lying area, away from residential areas and drinking water sources for humans and livestock.

4.2.2 Medicated bath and medicated shower equipment shall be used in accordance with the procedures specified in the operating instructions.

4.3 Requirements for Imported Sheep

Sheep should be introduced in accordance with quarantine requirements. After deworming, sheep should not be grazed for 5 days; they should be kept in enclosures, and their manure should be collected and fermented.
