1 Scope

GB/T 21761-2008 is the Chinese national standard on guide for the establishment of pest free areas, in the field of agriculture. The /T suffix marks it as a recommended standard: it is not compulsory by itself, but it becomes binding as soon as a contract, a tender or a customer specification calls it up - which in practice is how most foreign buyers meet it. It was issued on 14 April 2008 by the General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine of the People's Republic of China; Standardization

Administration of China, and has been in force since 15 July 2008. Classification: ICS 65.020, CCS B16. This page is published from the official record of the standard held by the Chinese standards administration: the identification, the dates, the classification and the issuing body are taken from there. The clause text, the tables and the numeric limits are in the document itself, which is delivered complete in English translation.

This standard provides for the establishment, maintenance and revocation of plant pests PFAs procedures and requirements. This standard applies to national and provincial-level administrative regions PFAs establish, maintain and withdraw.

2 Terms and definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this standard.

- 2.1 All or part of the official designated a province, or all or part of several provinces.
- 2.2 To determine is a pest infestation or areas where the pest is no such boundaries and carry out investigations.
- 2.3 To determine whether there is an area pest survey carried out.
- 2.4 To demonstrate the characteristics of a pest population and for the continuing investigation.

- 2.6 Scientific evidence shows that a specific pest does not occur and can timely holding official status in this area.
- 2.7 Press phytosanitary procedures, failed to check out a certain number of pests.
- 2.8 Designed to prevent quarantine pests and (or) diffusion or restrict non-quarantine pests and the economic impact of the development of law Law, regulation or official procedure.
- 2.9 The official quarantine pests in order to prevent the introduction and (or) or to limit the proliferation of non-quarantine pests economic impact of Provisions, including the development of phytosanitary certification procedures.
- 2.10 In an area to determine the characteristics of a pest population or to determine the presence of a species in a certain period to take the official program.
