a) *Vanilla fragrans* Ames, syn: *Vanilla planifolia* Andrews and in Bourbon, Indonesia, Mexico

In other regions, different names of vanilla are used in trade due to different geographical origins;

b) *Vanilla tahitensis* J.W. Moore;

c) Products obtained from hybrid seeds of *Vanilla fragrans* Ames:

This document does not apply to the production, research, teaching and trade of other vanilla plants (*Vanilla pomponaschiede*): in this document
