3 Terms and definitions

The terms and definitions defined in GB/T 27020, GB/T 27025, GB/T 27065 and GB/T 27068 and the following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1

Confirmation that specified requirements relating to the product are met.

Note. The definition of products includes services.

3.2

Demonstration of evidence that the relevant regulatory requirements are met.

3.3 mutual recognition

Mutual Recognition The relevant organizations involved in the conformity assessment activities recognize or jointly agree on the product conformity assessment results of other participants.

Note. Joint recognition can be the implementation of the same technical regulations, standards, technical solutions, the designation of other participants or the authorization of corresponding qualifications, in a legally binding document.

The document clearly recognizes the conformity assessment results of other participants and the acceptance of the supplier's self-declaration, etc.

3.4 evaluation evidence

Records, statements of fact, or other information that are relevant to the evaluation process and can be verified.

3.5 Evaluation Group

The collection of all parties involved in the mutual recognition evaluation of a product's conformity assessment results.

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
