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Introduction

The world today has evolved into an interdependent global community. Advances in technology and the evolution of economic relations lead to social management functions

And public resources are gradually showing the characteristics of cross-regional and cross-border. People's sense of security and well-being for organizations, local communities, countries and even the whole

The dependence of the core functional continuity of the ball community is increasing. In addition, the grim situation of public safety has led to the prevention of various types of emergencies in society.

Monitoring, disposal and recovery have placed higher demands.

Governments, social organizations and citizens play different roles in safeguarding public safety, and effective cooperation among them can increase

The efficiency of responding to incidents is therefore imperative to establish cooperative agreements to regulate cooperative behavior.

The term "organization" as used in this standard refers to the government, social organizations and citizens involved in dealing with public security incidents, and "collaborators" refers to cooperation.

This standard is intended to provide principles and procedures for establishing a cooperation agreement. Figure 1 shows the cooperation agreement from planning, development, implementation to review.

Cooperation agreements can improve the organization's ability to prevent, prepare, respond to, and recover from emergencies, while also resisting emergencies to the organization itself.

And the potential impact of the environment. There are many forms of cooperation agreements, both formal and informal. For example. contracts, memos, mutual

Assistance agreements, cooperation agreements, coordination agreements, operating agreements, supply agreements, etc.

The implementation of this standard shall also comply with the relevant laws, regulations

and rules, and it is recommended that the organization consult legal professionals before establishing a cooperation agreement.

Guide to establishing a cooperative agreement on public safety

1 Scope

This standard provides guidance to organizations in establishing collaborative agreements and helps address various relationships in public safety events. This standard

This standard applies to the establishment of cooperative relationships within and between governments, social organizations and citizens, and does not limit the type and size of organizations.

3 Terms and definitions

The following terms and definitions defined by ISO 22300 apply to this document.

3.1

Collaborative interoperability

The ability to work together between different systems and organizations.

3.2

Partnering

Collaboration with other organizations in an activity or area of mutual interest for individual or collective purposes.

4.1 Defining the purpose of the cooperation agreement

The initiator of the cooperation agreement should.

- Clarify the necessity of cooperation agreement;
- Consider current policies, roles, responsibilities and interests, and consider whether the cooperation agreement initiators and other potential partners benefit.

4.2 Identifying collaborators

The sponsor of the cooperation agreement should identify the organization with the appropriate characteristics as a potential collaborator.

To become a collaborator, you need to have the following characteristics.

- will be directly or indirectly affected by the same emergency;
- Ability to support, or contribute to, prevent, prepare, respond to, and resume work on related events;
- Ability to comply with laws and regulations.

Due to the uncertainty of the impact of the event, the sponsor of the cooperation agreement should conduct continuous monitoring and evaluation of the potential partners.
