1 Scope

GB/T 43214-2023 is the code of practice for preparing provincial territorial spatial plans. China's planning reform merged the separate land use, urban and main functional zone plans into a single territorial spatial plan, and the provincial plan is the level at which the three control lines - permanent basic farmland, the ecological conservation red line and the urban development boundary - are allocated downward to cities and counties, which makes

its preparation the most consequential planning exercise in the system. The standard sets the positioning and tasks of the plan, the preparation principles, scope, horizon, responsible body, basis and programme, the organisational and technical preparation, the basic research required, the preparation of the plan itself, and the review, approval, publication and implementation supervision that follow. It took effect on 1 January 2024.

This document establishes the positioning, tasks, and compilation principles of provincial territorial spatial planning, stipulates the compilation procedures and technical routes, and describes the planning Main contents such as program preparation and results requirements. This document is applicable to the preparation of territorial spatial planning of all provinces (autonomous regions), and the territorial spatial planning of municipalities and cross-administrative regions can be implemented as a reference.

3 Terms and definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1 territorial space territorial space The territorial space under the jurisdiction of national sovereignty and sovereign rights.

Note. Including land territorial space and maritime territorial space.

3.2 The overall deployment and overall arrangement in space and time for the development and protection of land space (3.1) in a certain area.

3.3 Activities to manage and protect regional spaces that carry important functions such as food security, ecological security, and energy resource security.

3.4 Utilization activities of land space focusing on industrialization, urbanization and agricultural production.

3.5 Follow the laws of nature and the inherent mechanism of the ecosystem, and adopt

natural restoration and adaptive measures for territorial spaces with degraded ecological functions and damaged ecosystems. Activities that maintain ecological security and promote a virtuous cycle of the ecosystem through human guidance and restoration.

3.6 Through land consolidation, reclamation, and development, promote comprehensive improvement of fields, water, roads, forests, villages, and cities, and improve urban and rural production, living conditions, and ecological environment. environment, promote large-scale agricultural operations, concentrated population residence, industrial cluster development, and promote the systematic engineering of urban and rural integration.
