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General requirements for cross-border access to species resources

1 Scope

This document establishes the process for acquiring cross-border species resources and stipulates the general requirements for acquiring cross-border species resources.

This document applies to the cross-border acquisition, inspection, supervision and Disposal.

This document does not apply to cross-border acquisition of pathogenic microorganisms that are highly pathogenic or suspected to be highly pathogenic.

3 Terms and definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1 cross-border

Exchange activities across national borders involving the acquisition of overseas species resources.

3.2 species resources

Plant, animal and micro-organism species and subspecies taxa and their genetic materials of actual or potential value.

Note 1. In addition to the species level, it also includes genetic resources within the species and germplasm resources in the sense of agricultural breeding.

Note 2. Usually includes but is not limited to seeds, seedlings, embryos, semen, strains, propagation materials, cells, etc.

3.3 prior informed consent

Species resource users must inform the species resource acquisition intention in advance, and species resource providers will decide based on the information provided by potential users. Whether to allow access.

3.4 mutually agreed terms

Conditions agreed upon in writing between species resource users and resource providers.

Note. Including but not limited to descriptions of dispute resolution clauses, benefit content and distribution plan, third-party transfer conditions, changes in resource use, etc.

3.5 benefit sharing

Share the benefits arising from the subsequent application and commercialization of introduced species resources fairly and equitably.

Note. Includes monetary and non-monetary benefits.
