1 Scope

GB/T 44960-2024 is the Chinese terminology standard for special police equipment, and it is the vocabulary that every other Chinese police equipment standard, procurement specification and test method now refers back to. That role makes a terminology document unusually useful to an outside reader: it is the single place where the entire Chinese police equipment taxonomy is laid out and defined. It covers the basic terms, then police instruments classified as interception, restraint, attack, assault, explosive ordnance disposal, reconnaissance and observation and carrying equipment; police protective equipment, ballistic, riot and explosive search and disposal; police vehicles, divided into scene response, special duty and support vehicles; police weapons and ammunition, firearms, cartridges, riot guns, riot launchers and riot control ammunition; police uniforms, clothing, accoutrements, headgear, footwear and uniform materials; unmanned police equipment, both unmanned aircraft and robots; and police signs and markings. An index closes the document. It applies to the research, production, inspection, management, use,

maintenance and teaching of special police equipment, which in practice means anyone supplying, testing or specifying such equipment in China.

This document defines the terms and definitions of special police equipment. This document applies to the scientific research, production, inspection, management, use, maintenance and teaching of special police equipment.

3 Basic terminology

3.1 Police equipment *policeequipment* Equipment that people's police are equipped with and use in accordance with the law when performing their duties and enforcing the law.

Note. Including police equipment, police protective equipment, police vehicles, police weapons, police uniforms, police unmanned equipment, police signs and logos, police communication equipment, police aircraft Aircraft, etc.

3.2 Police equipment *police instrument* Equipment used by people's police when on duty and enforcing the law.

3.3 Equipment that can protect the people's police's safety when on duty and enforcing the law.

3.4 Police vehicle *policevehicle* The people's police perform on-site handling, special duties, police support and other tasks and are equipped with on-board police equipment, body painting police car exterior Motor vehicles with standard signs.

3.5 Police weapons *policeweapon* Weapons that people's police are equipped with and use in accordance with the law when performing their duties and enforcing the law.

3.6 Police uniform A general term for the standard uniforms, shoes, hats, and accessories worn by the people's police.

3.7 Equipment controlled by a remote control device or a program control device that comes with the equipment and is used by the people's police when on duty or enforcing the law.

Note. Including unmanned aerial vehicles, robots, unmanned underwater vehicles, unmanned boats, self-service equipment, etc.

3.8 Police emblem Special texts and patterns that can represent the professional characteristics of the people's police.

Note. This includes but is not limited to logos, flags, certificates and signs.
