1 Scope

GB/T 45073-2024 standardises the signage of Chinese national parks. China formally established its first five national parks in 2021 and is building a system that will eventually cover a very large part of the country's most sensitive land, managed by different provincial bodies; without a common sign system the visitor crossing from one park to the next has to relearn what a boundary marker or a prohibition means, and the parks lose the single identity the system was created to give them. The standard sets the basic requirements and then each family of sign in turn - guidance signs, boundary markers, information and interpretive signs, warning signs, prohibition signs and equipment identification - covering their graphics, wording, materials, siting and installation, with normative annexes fixing the sizes of the graphic symbols and the colour numbers to be used. It took effect on 28 November 2024.

This document specifies the patterns, text, colors and sizes of signs for national park guidance, boundaries, reminders, warnings, prohibitions and equipment. content. This document applies to the production, installation and use of signs in national parks, and shall be used as a reference for nature reserves and natural parks.

3 Terms and definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1 National Park It is established and managed by the state with the main purpose of protecting national representative natural ecosystems and realizing the scientific and technological development of natural resources. specific areas for scientific protection and rational use. [Source: GB/T 45072-2024, 3.4]

3.2 Signage It has the function of marking, explaining or guiding, and is an easily recognizable symbol system composed of elements such as patterns, words, numbers or direction indicators.

3.3 Logo A special symbol with specific representative meaning, composed of elements such as patterns, words or numbers.

4 Basic Requirements

4.1 Materials National park signs should be made of natural, recyclable and pollution-free materials that are durable, waterproof, sun-proof, corrosion-resistant and frost-proof.

4.2 Dimensions Unless otherwise specified in the text, the size of the logo shall be in accordance with Appendix A. When the logo is rectangular, its width shall be in accordance with the square in Appendix A.
