3 Terms and Definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1 Departments or units under the county-level government that are responsible for animal disease prevention and control.

Note. This includes veterinary authorities, animal health supervision agencies, animal disease prevention and control agencies, and township (street) agencies responsible for animal disease prevention and control.

3.2 The evaluation agency, in accordance with relevant evaluation standards, comprehensively assesses a region's veterinary management system, the operational efficiency of its veterinary system, and its quality level. evaluate.

4 Evaluation Principles

4.1 Scientific nature Respecting the development characteristics of grassroots veterinary institutions, the assessment should be organized and implemented scientifically and rationally. The selection of assessment methods and indicator systems should strive for scientific rigor. Learn rationally.

4.2 Effectiveness Based on the management needs and assessment objectives of grassroots veterinary institutions, assessment content was designed and compared with the assessment indicator system in a targeted manner, ensuring objectivity and thoroughness. To accurately and comprehensively reflect the status and performance of grassroots veterinary institutions and give full play to the guiding role of evaluation.

4.3 Systemic Adhering to a systematic and comprehensive perspective in the assessment, we accurately grasp the inherent logic of the functions, resources, activities, and impacts of grassroots veterinary institutions. The system treats grassroots veterinary institutions as a whole and conducts a systematic evaluation of them.
