1 Scope

GB/Z 40893.6-2021 is the Chinese national standard on specification for operation technologies of traditional chinese medicine - pediatrics - part 6: burning rush moxibustion, in the field of health care technology. The /Z suffix marks it as a guiding technical document: it does not prescribe requirements that can be certified against, but sets out the technique, the method or the state of the art that the standards bodies recommend following. It was issued on 26 November 2021 by the State Administration for Market Regulation; Standardization Administration of China. As a guiding technical document it carries no separate date of entry into force: it applies from publication. Classification: ICS 11.020, CCS C04. This page is published from the official record of the standard held by the Chinese standards administration: the identification, the dates, the classification and the issuing body are taken from there. 3 Terms and definitions

The following terms and definitions apply to this document.

3.1 Burningrushmoxibustioninpediatrics Dip one end of the rush with vegetable oil to directly or indirectly burn the acupoints or lesions to achieve the purpose of external treatment.

Note. Also known as lamp therapy. Mainly divided into Ming Denghuo and Yin Denghuo.

3.2 Directmoxibustionbyburningrush Use rush dipped in vegetable oil to ignite a certain point directly, and the fire will self-extinguish when it touches the skin. The external treatment method of quickly removing the rush is a lamp A kind of fire method.

Note. Also known as Yang Denghuo.

3.3 Indirectmoxibustionbyburningrush The doctor burns the ignited rush on the belly of his thumb and presses down on the selected acupoints quickly. A sort of.

Note. Also known as Yin Denghuo.

3.4 Acupuncture point The qi from the viscera and meridian of the human body is infused into special parts of the body surface.

3.5 Rush The dried stem pith of the Juncus plant rush.

3.6 Vegetableoil The fats and oils obtained from the processing of plant fruits, seeds, and germs are compounds composed of unsaturated fatty acids and glycerin.
